Ministry of Catechist

The late Pope Francis instituted the formal ministry of Catechist to recognise the vital role lay people play in handing on the faith. He highlighted the responsibility of the baptised to share the Gospel and deepen others in Christian life. It affirms catechesis as a vocation,

not just a task and strengthens the Church's mission of evangelisation. It also honours countless catechists whose witness sustains communities and nurtures faith across generations.

In Ossory we will soon approach a programme of discernment and formation for those who, already living their faith in Christ according to their Baptismal calling, now feel drawn to share that faith and to minister to God's people in a formal and committed way within our parishes and pastoral areas.

Therefore, the weekend of 25/26 Oct. is dedicated as *Mission and Ministry* weekend in our Diocese. Its focus will be on giving thanks to God for the ministries already flourishing within our respective parish and pastoral area communities and promoting the vocation to lay catechetical and pastoral ministry. Promotional materials and a detailed outline of the steps for those who feel called to pursue this path and apply as candidates.

As we consider potential candidates, we might reflect on questions such as: What pastoral needs or ministerial opportunities exist within your community? Are there individuals who would willingly engage in a vetting and selection process, and - if accepted - commit to a formal period of discernment beginning the first week of Advent this year, followed by a three-year, parttime formation course beginning in September 2026? It's a significant commitment, but it is precisely because this programme prepares candidates for formal ministry that such dedication is necessary.

We are all invited to prayerfully consider people in our Parish and Pastoral Area who display charisms essential for ministry to contemplate to forward.
