Confirmation 2020 will take place in this Parish on Saturday 29th August.

Once, during a particularly severe winter in the Arctic, all but two people in a certain camp died of starvation. The two survivors were an Eskimo woman and her baby.

The woman began a desperate search for some means of obtaining food. Eventually she found a small fishhook. It was a simple matter to rig a line, but she had no bait, and no hope of getting bait. Without a moment's hesitation she took a knife and cut a piece of flesh from her thigh. Using this as bait she caught a fish. She fed her child and herself, saving the fish gut for bait. She lived on fish until spring when she walked out of the camp and found some other people. It was not coincidence that the only adult to survive in that camp was a mother. What kept that mother alive was her concern fir her child. There seems to be no limit to what a mother will go through for the sake of her child. A mother doesn't give up easily.
