**November Masses for the Dead:** This year Masses for those who died since last November, and all the dead, will be offered each Friday at 7pm. Next Friday we will be particularly conscious of all who died May, June and July. We invite families of the deceased of those months to provide us with a photograph which we will keep in the Church for the month.

**The List of the Names of the Dead:** A basket is provided in the Parish Church. Please bring your list of those whom you commend to our prayers during November. Each day while the Church is open a candle will be lit to show the prayers rising for your deceased relatives, friends and neighbours. **Evening Prayers** will be held on our radio and webcam during November as the sun goes down and the evening draws in, at 5pm on Sunday, Tuesday and Thursday.

With the benefit of webcam, some of the classes at the National School will join us for Mass on Wednesday, from their classrooms.

The Plan for living with Covid-19 at Level 3. Places of Worship will have to remain closed except for private prayer, weddings and funerals.

For Religious Services in places of worship (including weddings and funerals), up to 25 can be admitted, with social distancing, etc. Face coverings are requested. The limit of 6 is for indoor settings in homes and applies to funeral related events in private homes (e.g. wakes, etc). Much as we would want to return to Mass, we should stay at home and participate, as now, via webcam, social media, television or radio. "Father of all that is good, keep us faithful in serving you." May we learn to care better for the Master's goods so that when the Master returns, we will hear those blessed words: "Well done! Come and share your master's joy."
