Please note the times for Holy Week ceremonies in Thomastown. While congregations will be joining the ceremonies online or on television or radio, you may decide to join at a time suitable to you and your family. Our evening ceremonies have been scheduled for a similar time to reduce confusion. Booklets with the Holy Week ceremonies are available at the Parish Church. You may like to take one so that you will be better able to participate in the Ceremonies.

The Chrism Mass is a diocesan occasion when Bishop Nulty, our Diocesan Administrator while we await the appointment of a Bishop, will bless the oils which will be used for the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, Anointing of the Sick, and the anointing of our new Bishop. The ceremony will take place at the Cathedral in Kilkenny on Wednesday 31st March at 7.30pm. join on www.stmaryscathedral.ie As this is a diocesan event, we strongly encourage you to join with Bishop Nulty – specially if you or a family member may be presenting for the Sacraments in the year ahead. Palms will be blessed at Mass on Sunday. Call and collect some, or bring some palm to your sacred space on this Saturday or Sunday for blessing – a sign of your welcome for Jesus.

As Jesus blessed food at the Last Supper, let your evening meal on Thursday be held in a spirit of gratitude for the company and for those who have produced and prepared the food.

Bring a crucifix to your sacred space on Good Friday – to be venerated, as in Church.

For the Easter Vigil be sure to have a candle - reminder of the Easter Candle of new life in Christ.

The Rosary will be held on radio and webcam each day during Holy Week at midday.

First Communions and Confirmations 2021. You will appreciate that it is very difficult to schedule First Penance, First Communions and Confirmation during the current pandemic as numbers gathered in Church are restricted. Currently the plan is to have First Communions on Saturday 29th May and Saturday 12th June, with two Masses each day so that numbers are kept low.

The Sacrament of Confirmation is scheduled for Friday 18th June, with four sessions that day. The teachers will organise the schedules.

Whereas it is possible to control the numbers in the Church, a real concern is the gathering afterwards. Parents / guardians are reminded that there will be restrictions regarding people gathering in homes, so it will be vitally important to observe those restrictions also. A positive consideration is that we are forced to strip down the occasions to their essentials and will have to put aside some of the unnecessary trimmings that have become part of the day. Do please remember that the dates will depend on how we are all doing to manage the virus. We may have to decide to change the dates if circumstances are unfavourable.
