Re-opening Ireland: Thank you for your efforts to play your part in re-opening Ireland. It is good news that as the country reopens further, from Monday 6th September the numbers permitted by the State to gather for Church Ceremonies is extended to 50% of venue capacity. Our stewards, to whom we're very grateful for their service, will continue to guide us in this regard.

Meanwhile, we remember that we still need to observe social distancing inside and outside our Churches. Facemasks must be worn at all Masses and ceremonies. Please use the hand sanitizer as you enter the Church. For Communion in the Parish Church, please continue to observe the one-way system – up the centre aisle and down the sides, beginning with those in the centre aisle. Communion is given in the hand only. And please take your copy of the Mass leaflet home.

The National School Day begins at 9.10am this year, rather than 9.30am, and we ask all to take good care entering and departing Church grounds.

First Communions / Confirmations: We plan to celebrate First Communions here in Thomastown on two days, 11^{th,} and 25th September at 12.00 noon. Confirmation will be held on Saturday 2nd October. Obviously, those dates can be changed if Covid-19 becomes a serious threat. It is good that the State is happy that families gathering to celebrate these Sacraments will be sensible in their family gatherings afterwards.

Thomastown Parish Pastoral Council will meet on Wednesday 8th September. The Parish Council consists of the Parish Priest together a representative group of Parishioners. The role of the Council is to promote the Church's mission to live and communicate the love, values and teaching of Christ in our world, addressing the issues which affect the lives of the people.

The Cathedral Draw In each Diocese the Cathedral is regarded as the Church at the heart of the Diocese, the Church where the Bishop presides over the life of the Diocese. Over the past few years work has been done to renovate the Cathedral, and this work is continuing. In that time $\in 600,000$ has been raised through a Restoration Fund Draw. The new Draw begins this month with the first draw on the last Wednesday of September and will continue for the year. Subscriptions cost $\notin 10$ each month, with $\notin 500$ in prizes each month. Please consider supporting the Draw. Season of Creation2021: Restoring our Common Home takes place this year from 1st September to 4th October, the feast of St. Francis of Assisi. During this season we are asked to join together to celebrate creation and protect our common home through prayer, reflection and action. Resources for the Season of Creation are available on <u>www.catholicbishops.ie</u> You'll see there that Trocaire has drawn up a list of 100 ways for parishes to implement Laudato Si. The Parish Council will be looking at this list. Meanwhile, a few suggestions that each of us could take up

- Walk to Mass if you live reasonably close. Otherwise, leave the car a distance away and walk the rest of the way. This will mean leaving home a little earlier, of course.

- Use washable, rather than disposable napkins, mugs, etc.

- Switch off lights when leaving a room.

- Don't leave electrical appliances on stand-by.
