November Masses for those who died since last November and for all the dead: we will call them to mind at our four Friday Masses in November, three months at a time. Bernie Dempsey and Sister Bernadette will be looking for photographs which we will put up in Church, so it will help greatly if you have a photograph ready for them – or leave it into the Parish Office. If you've lost a loved one who is buried elsewhere, feel free to provide a photograph, and we will be very happy to remember them also.

World Mission Sunday is the Holy Father's annual appeal for spiritual and financial support so that the life-giving work of overseas mission and missionaries can continue. It always falls on the second last Sunday in October, meaning this year it will be celebrated on Sunday 24

October. This year's theme 'We Cannot Remain Silent - We cannot but speak about what we have seen and heard (Acts 4:20)' is twofold. It is a message of hope – Jesus Christ is risen and we cannot keep his love, compassion, and mercy to ourselves. It also challenges us to stand up and speak out on behalf of those who are weaker. All too often, the voices that need to be heard are not the loudest. For them, we cannot remain silent.

A Letter box has been inserted in the sacristy door for those who wish to leave envelopes or notices for the Newsletter. It is deemed more secure to do it this way because the collection box could be emptied when the Church is quiet.

Government advises that COVID-19 infection rates are once again increasing along with hospitalisation and ICU admissions. However, thanks to the hard work and exceptional support of the Irish people for the Vaccination Programme, we can continue our careful and gradual approach to re-opening. We will need to continue to monitor the ongoing risk from the disease and, including through testing and contact tracing as appropriate. We will all need to take steps individually and collectively in our everyday lives to keep this risk under control, in particular by - acting fast, isolating and getting tested if we have symptoms;

- wearing our face coverings where appropriate;
- making sure that indoor spaces are well ventilated;
- maintaining adequate social distancing whenever appropriate; and
- covering our coughs and sneezes and keeping our hands clean by using sanitizers. .

From October 22 Religious services and weddings can proceed without capacity limits but with all other protective measures remaining in place. The directions seem confusing, so for the moment, until there is more clarity, we will uphold the current social distancing in the Church. For Communion in the Parish Church, please continue to observe the one-way system – up the centre aisle and down the sides, beginning with those in the centre aisle. Communion is given in the hand only. And please take your copy of the Mass leaflet home.
