St. Colmcille Pastoral Area: Bishop Nulty, our Administrator, will visit the Pastoral Area and celebrate Mass in Inistioge on Sunday at 11am. The purpose of the visit is to encourage the growth of collaboration among our two parishes of Inistioge and Thomastown. We must see how we can better promote the reign of God among us by doing things together.

Trocaire East Africa Hunger Crisis: Countries like Sudan, South Sudan, Somalia, and Ethiopia are experiencing escalating climate change, conflict, swarms of desert locusts, and Covid. Over 30 million children, women and men are being pushed into starvation. Without emergency food and aid, many more won't survive. Lives depend on our ability to reach them. The Bishops Conference has agreed for and Emergency Collection this weekend. Our congregations on Saturday and Sunday are invited to support the Collection coming out of Mass. If unable to be at Mass you may like to support the Trocaire appeal directly, or leave a contribution in an envelope marked Trocaire at the Church sacristy or Parish Office.

Archbishop Dermot Farrell will visit Ossory on Tuesday 9th November. Because of Covid gatherings have had to be restricted, but on Tuesday at 7.30pm the archbishop will join with us for Evening Prayer. You would be welcome to join the occasion.

Government advises that **COVID-19** infection rates are once again increasing along with hospitalisation and ICU admissions. We will need to continue to monitor the ongoing risk from the disease and, including through testing and contact tracing as appropriate. We will all need to take steps individually and collectively in our everyday lives to keep this risk under control, in particular by - acting fast, isolating and getting tested if we have symptoms;

- wearing our face coverings where appropriate;
- making sure that indoor spaces are well ventilated;
- maintaining adequate social distancing whenever appropriate; and
- covering our coughs and sneezes and keeping our hands clean by using sanitizers. .

From October 22 Religious services and weddings can proceed without capacity limits but with all other protective measures remaining in place. The directions seem confusing, so for the moment, until there is more clarity, we will uphold the current social distancing in the Church. For Communion in the Parish Church, please continue to observe the one-way system – up the centre aisle and down the sides, beginning with those in the centre aisle. Communion is given in the hand only. And please take your copy of the Mass leaflet home.

A youth trip to Taizé in France organised by Ossory Youth will take place from Sunday 26th June to Sunday 3rd July 2022. A week in the Taizé Community is an opportunity for reflection and contemplation and a little step back from daily life. But bringing people together is also the essence of Taize and it is a week of meeting young people from different countries and cultures where new friendships are made. Tens of thousands of young people from around the world, including 25 from Kilkenny, will made the trip to Taizé next year. The programme, which runs from December 2021 to July 2022 is open to Transition year, 5th year and Leaving Cert students. Closing date is Friday 19th November.
