While the Irish Bishops have requested that the Irish Church embark on a 'Synodal Journey' over the next few years, Pope Francis has requested a worldwide Synod, with the theme 'Towards a Synodal Church'. The Synod, and Synodal Way, is to establish a new style, a new approach, a new way of being Church. He wishes for us to rediscover the sense of the Church as 'The People of God', leading to a growth of 'communion, participation and mission'. For that reason, he has called for every parish in the world (!) to be engaged in this conversation. That includes Thomastown. When the findings from each parish are filtered through to Rome this year, next year will involve further consultations, leading to a Gathering in Rome in 2023.
