Reflection: The idea that we are loved unconditionally is difficult to take onboard. Paul Tillich in his book 'The Courage to be' said Faith is the courage to accept acceptance. Our experiences tell us we are not always accepted. Rejection and alienation can often define us. Yet God's Love is unconditional and total. That is why Tillich uses the word 'courage'. We must make the leap of faith from our doubt to accept acceptance. When we do, we enter a world where we are loved, accepted and understand how much we are loved. The words of God in Isaiah are addressed to us...' You are precious in My eyes and honoured and I love you. (Isa 43:4).
