St. Canice, the patron of the county and city, is remembered on 11th October. He was born in Co. Derry around 527 and died in 603. He was a contemporary and friend of St. Colmcille, with whom he worked in Scotland for some time. Coming home, he founded a Church in Aghaboe – on the road between Roscrea and Ballacolla. This was at one time where the bishop resided. Later the Bishop's centre was moved to the Nore, at Kilkenny – the Church of Canice. This move was made by Bishop Felix O Dulany, who had been a monk of Jerpoint and whose remains are buried in the Church sanctuary there.

Why not visit St. Canice's Cathedral and St. Mary's Cathedral this week to recall something of the history of our Diocese.

In honour thou dost rank with Ireland's Enlightener, O Lover of the Desert, Composer of sacred verse, Father of Monks and Founder of Monasteries, O Father Cainnech.
