Mass on Wednesday 28th will be offered for **our Civil War Dead.** We recall John Phelan and John Murphy, executed on 29th December 1922 in Kilkenny and buried in the Belfry Cemetery, and Patrick Francis Carney. He was a Revenue Commissioner who worked for a time in Thomastown, married local woman Constance Grace and died on 27th February after injuries when the Customs and Excise office in Beresford Place was burned on 21st February. He was buried in the Belfry Cemetery also, with his wife's people.
