"In the natural world, nothing is more dead than ash, a substance produced by the perishing of other substances. Job, the upright and blameless man, sat among the ashes when he lost his sons and daughters, his health and dignity. On Ash Wednesday, we are signed with ashes. We are reminded that 'you are dust, and to dust you shall return'. Also, we are signed with ashes as a sign of a 'battle', as a sign of our commitment to fight. In communion with Christ, to whose Passion and Rising we look forward, we set out to fight death and all that is of death. This may seem an outrageous claim, and yet it is the heart of our Christian call, duty and privilege. The death we focus on these days is the spiritual death we inflict on ourselves when we snuff out the divine light of grace by compromises with darkness. We confess and ask forgiveness for our half-heartedness, for our betrayals small and great. Together, as a people, we own our tendency to follow the paths of self-destruction and empty promises. The ashes make a bond among us. They make it easier for us to help each other choose the right way, to offer a word of support, an arm to lean on, when we see each other falter".
