**Saint Kieran** was the first Bishop of Ossory, and his Feast is held on 5<sup>th</sup> March. **K**ieran's father belonged to the *kingdom of Ossory*. On a trip to the southwest of Ireland he met a woman called *Liadán*, Kieran was born of their marriage and, according to the *Lives*, was fostered on Cape Clear, where there are many monuments dedicated to him.

Kieran set out for Rome, where he was baptised and studied scripture. On his way back to Ireland it is said he met St Patrick, who told him exactly where to found his settlement, giving him a bell which would only ring when he found the place. This turned out to be Saighir Chiaráin, near the village of Clareen about four miles south-east of Birr, Co Offaly.

Saighir Chiaráin was the chief church of the people of Ossory for some time. There is a monastic site with sacred well and the saint's bush still very popular at the place near Clareen in Co Offaly. However, ecclesiastically Seir Kieran seems to have been superseded by the later monastic foundation of St Canice at nearby Aghaboe. And it was Canice who was to be the patron of the church established by the Normans in the city of Kilkenny.

After the penal times, in 1782, Bishop John Thomas Troy of Ossory (later Archbishop of Dublin) established a Catholic diocesan seminary, St Kieran's College, in Kilkenny. The motto he gave it was: *Hiems transiit*, a quotation from the Song of Songs applied to the passing of the winter of the Penal Laws in Ireland. When the Catholic cathedral was built in 1843, although it was called St Mary's, it also has Kieran as its secondary patron and Kieran is the patron saint of the Catholic diocese of Ossory.

**St. Patrick – how would he speak to a modern Ireland**: Fr. Billy Swan will address this topic at St. Kieran's College on Monday 7<sup>th</sup> March at 7.30pm. It is easy to leave Saints confined to our past. It is hard to imagine them in our world today and yet our study of them and the Gospel messages they shared can surely provide much fruit for today.
