Lent begins on 14th February – next Wednesday. Traditionally, for us Catholics this is a time of self-denial, saying no to self so that we can with greater freedom say yes to God and to others.

 FASTING - In addition to food items, fasting might include limiting or giving up for a time: cellphone, social media,news/entertainments, criticism of self/others. Or try early bedtime.

ALMSGIVING- In addition to monetary contribution, almsgiving could include forgiving someone, giving the gift of a spiritual book, writing to old friends, making quality time for someone neglected, visit a nursing home, volunteering, smiling and making eye contact.

PRAYER- Making a nightly appointment with Jesus, reading a spiritual book or through a book of the Bible, picking a saint to be your Lenten prayer partner/helper, praying a 40-day novena for someone in your life, incorporating a gratitude practice by thanking God morning and evening for the daily blessings.

The Aid arm of the Irish Bishops Conference is **Trocaire**. This year's Lenten appeal puts the spotlight on Malawi. The people there are poverty-stricken, and the problem is heightened because of climate change. Take home a Trocaire package, if the children in the National School haven't already brought home one.
